Would also like to know what the state and others are doing about it.  • the GOAT committee has yet to meet, nor has it defined its charge but does seem to align as a mirror organization to the federal DOGE agency in Wisconsin. This has already had impacts on health departments across the state.  • Significant concern as it also pertains to funding, not only federally but state/local.  • This information has already been shared with the state for awareness and discussion. WCA is also working on providing guidance as well as the League of Wisconsin Municipalities (see <a href="here">here</a> ).  • The letters have also been going to municipalities as well as health departments. Review of changes/updates to PHC website.  5. update: WPHA Conference session 6. update: PHC reappointments	Paula Morgen, Chair	The group began with a discussion to review the most recent Public Health Council meeting on 2/7. Paula particularly highlighted the background information on the governor's budget and if the PHC would need to engage in any action in support of the budget. This could also include setting up an additional PHC meeting to discuss more. Paula also referenced Michael Best's overview of the budget and opportunities. Highlights of the discussion & questions included:  • Engaging with WPHA/WALHDAB to align budget related efforts would be a great idea for whatever action is decided.  • Lots of opportunities for SHP aligned efforts.  • A 2-3 hour meeting between PHC and WPHA/WALHDAB was proposed for discussion on alignment.  • Aisha suggested an extension or repurpose of an upcoming EC meeting (on March 28 <sup>th</sup> ) prior to the April 4 <sup>th</sup> meeting.

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	<ul> <li>What is window for advocacy/action? Generally-speaking, any advocacy would need to be to the joint finance committee by roughly June. Most impactful engagement would likely be through individual members.</li> <li>WPHA will be holding a meeting with DHS OS on March 10<sup>th</sup> to discuss budget and any PHC members that are part of WPHA are suggested to attend; language was shared language from an email about this to share with the PHC.</li> <li>Paula indicated that she would reach out to Jamie Michael to identify the desire/need and will work with Aisha to schedule a meeting, if possible. The attendees will include all of the EC there, representation from the Issues Committee, PHEPAC, and SHP Committee.</li> <li>Question for state staff: would it be appropriate for state staff to be a part of this meeting/conversation? PHC will lead the meeting &amp; state staff could be present to support logistically, provide updates programmatically, or take notes, but would need to be mindful of how involved they could be due to conflict of interest.</li> <li>What would we want to tackle in terms of state vs. federal budget? Focus would likely be most on state budget/funding but these are linked and would like to also consider federal funding changes in the process as they are linked. PHCs need to be very clear of asks to advocate with the state legislature. This goes broader to federal budget impacts as well. This has also been a topic for PHEPAC and that they have shared interest in advocacy.</li> <li>Are we able to get an additional download on tracking of federal budget impacts as part of this? This seems to be something that was discussed in the PHC meeting and perhaps staff could support with an environmental scan and risk assessment of impact? This is going to be hard to track at the moment with things being up in the air but</li> </ul>
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The discussion then transitioned to looking over the <u>public health</u> <u>council website</u> for review. Aisha gave an overview of the pages and asked for input on what is missing/needed and if members would like PHC members' affiliations/representation listed.

- No concerns raised about listing affiliations/representation.
- There was a question about missing meeting minutes/agendas for more recent meetings (within the last year)—Aisha indicated she would check in with the website contact for that as items shifted in the update.
- Suggestion to add a section for Contact Us to include a point-of-contact for concerns/issues to address from the Issues Committee.
- PHEPAC edits were in progress, and not live at the time.

#### Updates on WPHA Conference session:

A meeting is being planned to help plan and assign tasks for putting together the presentation/panel/Q&A. The session will be held on May 21<sup>st</sup> at 2:30pm. Focus of the presentation is on the council itself, engagement/collaboration beyond, which includes WPHA/WALHDAB. Not only what has been done so far but opportunities for the future.

#### Update on PHC appointments:

Staff support is working to stagger appointments with the GO and it appears that there may be an option in place for this moving forward, understanding that there may be some limitations in the short-term but this will likely result in a good staggering of renewal and refreshing of representation. Aisha and others are working on this and will share more as it becomes available. Additionally, we have identified PHC liaisons for PHEPAC (Doug Gieryn and Laura Scudiere).

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<b>11:15 – 11:35</b> (15 minutes)	Discuss & provide feedback:  Drafted Statement re: Gun violence as PH issue	Jordan-Lindsay Morris-Greer, Chair-Elect	The conversation then shifted to a discussion and provision of feedback on the Drafted Statement regarding gun violence as a PH issue. If approved, this could be put on the PHC website as an initial location for highlighting the PHC stance and then we could also distribute in letter form in other areas if we choose to do so.  Noting that this is something that is also connected to one of the main charges of the PHC, the State Health Plan, which is why it is highlighted extensively here.  A suggestion was made to move a statement that discusses root causes before the bullet points.  Opening feels late to send condolences—rather than sending that, be more factual in the statement. This was not a completely shared perspective so this should be just left for consideration.  Should also consider including a connection to PHEP through planning for and response to mass shooting event. This document should be shared for awareness with PHEPAC and consider seeking feedback from them, depending on timing.  Include a why statement for the section on emotional health and well-being for consistency.  Recommendation to also include Sara Kohlbeck's perspective, given her area of focus/expertise.  The group also discussed possibilities for action and communication to others. WPHA/WALHDAB was one potential communication source as well as the usual communication structure for DHS Secretary, Legislature, and Governor (beyond the website).

#### PHEPAC:

PHEPAC now has PHC liaisons (Doug and Laura). In response to the challenge of document storage and access on behalf of the group, the PHEPAC has created a section on the PCA Portal for shared work. The group also updated the PHEPAC Mechanisms to Action to move issues, concerns, and proposals forward to ensure that Wisconsin can address emergency preparedness events. This also included a flow chart/process for establishing PHEPAC Urgent/Special Meeting Processes. The group was also discussing and looking for feedback on where to provide updates and engage input with PHC. Executive Committee would be the first logical place and can extend to the rest of the PHC from there.

The committee has been discussing providing a letter of support regarding public health preparedness funding to send to the governor and legislature focusing on PHEP as a foundational public health service/capability. Brittany shared a draft of this support letter for awareness. This letter still needs to be approved by the PHEPAC before shared more broadly.

- Jordan also suggested that this be finalized sooner rather than later to present to the legislature's Joint Committee on Finance during the feedback period (April/May).
- Should the PHEP funding also be a priority for the WPHA/WALHDAB meeting where we prioritize actions?
