#### 4. Review and Approve Previous Meeting Minutes

- 5. Specific Committee Items for Discussion (Public Comment)
  - a. State Standards: BAS follows DOL guidance of 1 apprentice to 1 journeyworker/skilled worker for safety and training purposes. BAS will be requesting some potential revisions after DOL issues new rule changes.
     Section 1, #3 D discussion regarding ratio wording. Concerns voiced by Ken Heins regarding the highlighted text. Liz shared the extensive process involved in getting that wording changed.

Program standards must identify a numeric ratio of apprentices to journeyworkers that is consistent with proper supervision, training, safety, and continuity of employment. The ratio language shall be specific as to its application to the job site, workforce, department, or plant—with the employer's workforce being the preferred manner of expressing the ratio for Wisconsin registered apprenticeship programs. The ratio shall not exceed one journeyworker per apprentice, except where a collective bargaining agreement applies, then the ratio prescribed in the agreement may be used.

State Standards, Section 2, #4 A,B Requirements for Supervision regarding direct and indirect supervision was shared and reviewed for clarification.

A. Apprentices in all Machine Tool occupations in all years shall work under direct supervision. Direct Supervision means the journeyworker or qualified individual shall assume the responsibility of an activity of the apprentice and the results by providing oversight and guidance at the site where the activity is being conducted. The apprentice shall have quick and easy access to the journeyworker or qualified individual to communicate about a job.

B. Apprentices in all Machine Tool occupations in all years may work under indirect supervision on jobs for which they are trained and qualified. Indirect supervision means the journeyworker or qualified individual shall assume the responsibility of an activity of the apprentice and the results by providing oversight and guidance while not at the site where the activity is being conducted. The apprentice must have immediate access to a journeyworker or qualified individual via phone, radio, or other electronic means.

Under no circumstances shall apprentices supervise other apprentices.

Waiver of ratio can be requested for unexpected staffing level changes. Request should be submitted directly to Deputy Director, Elizabeth Pusch.

#### b. WIDS: 5-Year Program Review Update

Curriculum/related instruction reviewed by WIDS/WTCS. Machine Tool information reviewed for first time in 10 years. Lynn shared the '23-24 Related Instruction proposed changes including course name changes, credit amount changes/shifts per course, course deletions - not eliminating content but integrating that content into other courses.

Committee members request a workgroup meeting to further review the changes before approving.

Expanded review will be provided at Fall meeting.

#### 6. WTCS Update – Jamie Bernthal

Ascendium Tools of the Trade Scholarship awards \$2000 to apprentices who qualify and apply. Ascendium is looking for those recipients to participate in a focus group for feedback. There is a \$50 stipend available for one time participation.
