- 1. The meeting was called to order at 10:03 a.m. by Co-Chair Jeff Merhoff, in conformance with the Wisconsin open meeting laws.
- 2. Attendees introduced themselves. Mr. Smith recorded attendance. A quorum was present.
- 3. The committee reviewed the roster. IUPAT DC7 will fill the current Employee vacancies.

Action: the Bureau will add "Elect Employer Co-Chair" to the agenda for the fall meeting

4. Actions

a. Approve the minutes

The minutes were approved as written.

b. Review the minimum scores for applicants.

Mr. Smith reported that the Bureau will review its recommendations and policies for statewide minimum scores for applicants this summer because they are now five years old. He asked the state committee how well its minimum scores are working.

The state committee reported that the revised scores they approved last year are working well.

c. Review the state Exhibit A for each registered apprenticeship.

Mr. Smith reported that he received a request that this item be discussed at the meeting.

Mr. Holmes reported that he and several colleagues proposed revising all of the state committee's registered apprenticeships to four-year, time-based programs. The current versions have proven unhelpful to contractors and apprentices because some contractors have completed apprentices too soon.

A general discussion followed. The state committee agreed with the concept of the revisions and recommended the Bureau convene a focus group over the summer to discuss them more thoroughly.

Mr. Smith agreed and noted that adopting a time-based term will require a minimum length that is expressed in years, months, or months and hours.

Action: the Bureau will convene a focus group in July to discuss the proposed revisions. Volunteers included Mr. Holmes, Mr. Niemic, Mr. Gifford, Mr. Macejkovic, and Mr. Merhoff.

Action: Prior to the focus group, Mr. Holmes will coordinate industry feedback how the minimum length should be written.

Mr. Macejkovic recommended the focus group revisit the proposed new registered apprenticeship, Painter-Decorator-Taper-Finisher. Mr. Smith stated that the state committee had expressed the program was no longer needed. Mr. Macejkovic clarified that contractors' interest in the program has reemerged.

Action: the Bureau will include the proposed PDTF program in the focus group agenda.

d. Review the related instruction.

The state committee reported that the related instruction is working well.

Attendees did not have questions or comments.

5. Discussions

a. BAS Director's Call with State Committees

Director Polk reviewed that the Bureau convened the first Director's Call with State Committees this spring. The objective was to share all updates pertinent to most or all committees in a single, virtual forum so that each state committee's meetings will focus on its unique needs. The forum was approved by the WI Apprenticeship Advisory Council. He asked the state committee for feedback to share with the Council.

The state committee supported the Director's Call. Members appreciated that is focuses their meetings on their own programs.

b. Modified format of state committee meetings

Director Polk and Mr. Smith clarified that future meetings will be held in-person and virtually and may be shorter.

The state committee supported the streamlined agenda and virtual option.

c. Pending review of Wisconsin Apprenticeship Manual

Director Polk reported that the *Manual* was reviewed and approved by the Council's Policy and Standards Subcommittee. It will be reviewed by the full Council in June. Once the Council approves the revisions, it will become an official working draft and a 90-day public comment period will begin. After the 90-day public comment period, all input will go back to the subcommittee and the Council for final approval.

Director Polk added that the Bureau will make the original version, revised version and a summary of changes available electronically.

Attendees did not have questions or comments.

d. Subsequent review of state committee standards

Mr. Smith explained that the *Manual* provides the boilerplate language that constitutes 90% of each state committee's state standards. Therefore, once the *Manual* is approved, BAS will update all state standards accordingly. He emphasized that the state committee's unique policies—such as its Exhibit A—will not change. Those are always available for the committee to review at its discretion.

Attendees did not have questions or comments.

- 6. The state committee reviewed the participant report and did not have questions or comments. .
- 7. The meeting adjourned at 11:10 a.m. The Bureau will schedule the next meeting via electronic survey.
