Reviewed data on 88,700 samples with 12 cases detected (all asymptomatic, likely adult onset cases). Unsure if Pompe will be nominated for addition to NBS through the metabolic subcommittee at this time.• Considering end-point for NICU NBS repeat testing: 1 month old or weight-based, versus 3 months old or weight-based. Committee discussion, but no decision at time of meeting.
