 DHS is in the process of updating and developing the next plan The Office of Health Equity (OHE) is leading the update of the E&I plan State statute requires agencies to set a plan of action to determine how we are going to ensure we operate equitably and inclusively and identify areas that may prevent us from ensuring all staff and Wisconsinites are living their best lives. This will require a lot of work. Dr. Robinson is forming the small team, the Planning and Development Team (PDT) to develop the plan. Included in the PDT is Tonya, Langeston and all of the E&I Division leaders. The HEDI will serve as the Agency Equity and Inclusion Advisory Committee (AEIAC). The PDT will report back to the HEDI on progress. OHE is developing the Charter and finalizing the membership of the PDT. The Secretary must approve the Charter and membership and then the work will begin. Initial meetings will start in April. Some of the HEDI will be tapped to help with some of foundational work.

 Governor's Budget DHS put forward two recommendations to DOA: Translation and Ombudsman <u>Translation:</u> DHS requested two positions and funding to translate content on the website and forms into two additional languages to improve access to the content by the public. We also asked for funding to form a communications advisory board and stipends for public members. We also requested statutory changes that would apply to all state boards and councils to allow public members with lived experience to receive modest stipends. The Governor included the funding for translation and IT work to facilitate the translation The Governor did not include the positions We did not get the stipend funding or the statutory changes we requested <u>Ombudsman:</u> DHS also requested funding for the ombudsman positions. The proposal was not included into the Governor's budget. The recommendation 					

included 1 FTE ombudsman for each division. It was not included in the	
Governor's budget.	
 1 FTE equity officer was in the Governor's budget for all state agencies.

 Budget goes to the Joint Finance Committee (JFC) 	
The legislative fiscal bureau is summarizing the items in the budget now	
JFC will hold 4 or 5 public hearings in April	
 JFC has not invited agencies to testify yet 	
 JFC will probably start voting in May and this will last until June. 	
 JFC will vote out a revised budget bill 	
 Each house of the legislature will consider and make other changes
