IV. Public Comment on Issues Affecting Assistive Technology Users

 Jenesis Lindbo provided public comment by expressing gratitude for the time she was able to spend on the AT Council and she has offered to remain involved as a public member.

V. Assistive Technology Program Partner Updates

- Laurie Lane from WisLoan shared that new vehicles loans can now can go out to 80 months and that the interest rate for all loans will remain at 4%.
- Dawn Merth-Johnson with the Department of Public Instruction shared that
 the AT Forward project recently added \$10,000 worth of low and mid range
 technology to the AT Lending Center. There has been some re-design of the
 micro credential and the Community of Practice meetings are set for this
 upcoming school year.
- Stacy Ellingen is presenting at the self-determination conference with the Technology First Coalition.
- Jim Rau, president of the WI Hearing Loss Association of America (HLAA)
 chapter shared that the VA is currently using a telehealth platform that does
 not allow for captions for visits. He has been advocating for this to change.
- BJ Ermenc shared that she attended the HLAA Convention in New Orleans and is learning how technology works as well as the next gen of Bluetooth and how it may override loop technology. She also serves on the Council for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing which will be reorganizing and having elections in October. She is looking forward to the United Voices Summit. She participated in an emergency practice session at the Green Bay airport so they can have people with disabilities represented. She also attended the event at Options for Independent Living yesterday. Talked with the GB transit about possibly adding loops to the bus and will be introducing them to Juliette

- Sterkens. City of Wauwatosa displayed the Disability Flag in the 4th of July Parade and a few additional promotions around the ADA. They are doing an accessible park. First phase will be done in 2024.
- Calvin has updates from the ILCs. He encourages everyone to sign up for each of the ILC newsletters. On August 25th Options had their Community Event to do a used equipment collection and it has expanded to a larger resource fair. Options did pre-collections with ADRCs within their service area. Options has been still doing sled-hockey events and some events are open to all and some are for the pro athletes. Consumers had beach access opportunities.
 - Access to Independence had a similar event on the same day.
 - Midstate IL hosted an adapted kayak event that was widely attended.
 - Independence First has been distributing disposable supplies as part of their food bank pickups.
 - o Indigo held their ADA celebration on July 26th.
 - CILWW recently collaborated with the LE Phillips library on website accessibility.
 - ILR provided information at three different booth events in their service area.
- Debra Remmel from DVR shared that they are still looking for additional referrals. The Career Pathways grant is serving almost 500 people (manufacturing, IT, healthcare). This provides for additional funds directed towards career goals in those areas.
- Julie Bergen, also will be joining the Independent Living Council for Wisconsin
- Jennifer Seale shared that they have several new staff members but they do
 have a position open for a speech pathologists. They will be doing a capacity
 building project around the state by collaborating with school districts.
- Jim Denham from WI Council of the Blind and Visually Impaired shared that
 they had an AI webinar and its impacts for people with vision loss. Some new
 apps are in development, including BeMyEyes (Be my AI). It's providing very
 in-depth image description. There is a recording of the webinar so Jim can

- share the link with those interested. Each year there is an art show and accepting applications for artists who have vision loss to submit their work. In November they have gallery night and then the art is up for sale.
- Cassie attended the kayak event with Midstate and it was a great experience.
 Cassie attended the International Society of Technology in Education conference. She saw an increase in conversation around the topic of accessibility. Cassie presented a session on iOS accessibility and the method was an escape room. WI CEC is going to host a conference again next spring.
- Deen Amusa shared that the next Living with Vision loss program is scheduled for September 18-22, 2023.

VI. WisTech Program Updates

- The quarterly data was reviewed and the dashboard shared with members.
- Three of the WisTech trainings for this fiscal year have been completed and two more are planned for September.
- WisTech attended both of the collections drives earlier this week; one in Madison and one in Green Bay.
- Table display materials have been ordered and will be distributed to each ILC for branding purposes.
- WisTech presented recently to DVR WDA #1 on Assistive Technology Resources and also did a presentation to community members for the Eau Claire ADRC.
