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Update on Getting Data Into (and out of) WE-TRAC	Kelsey Wilde (Stevenson)		Congrats to Kelsey Wilde (Stevenson) on welcoming baby Ira to her family! Kelsey is on maternity leave until late December. She provided the following information to be shared at the meeting:  The data is showing that the vast majority of babies are being screened. 1/800 babies are failing the screening.  Currently there is eight years of CCHD screening data (2013-2020), 400,000 babies screened.  How is data getting into WE-TRAC?  CCHD screening results are primarily entering WE-TRAC in two different ways:  Submission on the blood collection form  When results (or reason not screened) haven't been submitted with the blood collection form, midwives and birth facilities can update these results/reasons directly in WE-TRAC  Both results from the blood collection form and WE-TRAC are counted in the quarterly reports  CCHD case reports are entered directly into the SHINE side
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


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
	Currently:  We are able to run reports in WE-TRAC on CCHD screening results and use these to create our quarterly CCHD reports.  We are awaiting a data pull from SHINE case reports. These will be matched with some WE-TRAC data, which comes from demographic values off the blood collection form shared by WSLH  Future:  Following updates to WE-TRAC, in early 2022 we will be integrating SHINE case reports with existing WE-TRAC data  Will eliminate the issue of redundant/duplicative reports, as the system only allows on entry/child  Will allow us to include reports CCHD screening results or reasons not screened as a part of case reports  Lays the groundwork for improve our case-specific reporting capabilities  Continuing to pursue diverse opportunities to fund these efforts
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






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
