1. Introductions and Announcements (*informational*)
2. Review and approve June meeting minutes (*vote*)

3. Pediatric Falls Data Review (*informational/discussion*)
The group would like to review yearly. The age breakdown was helpful.
4. Playground Falls Highlights (*informational/discussion*)
American Family Children's Hospital presented their program on working with local town boards regarding safe surfacing on playgrounds.
Children's Wisconsin and Gundersen presented on their work with schools regarding safe surfacing and falls. Gundersen also brought playground injury tracking sheets, concussion stickers, and funding opportunities to their schools.
Marshfield Medical Center presented on their work with local schools on safe surfacing.
5. ATV/UTV Update (*informational/discussion*)
SB262 had an open hearing with executive action yesterday but a summary of what occur is not available yet.
Education opportunity with ATV association, WI DNS, and RideSafe.
6. Injury Prevention Resources Project Update (*informational/discussion*)
3 areas being collected: education, data sources, and toolkits by topic. This will be updated annually. This will ideally be housed on the state webpage.
7. Public comments related to injury prevention within the Wisconsin trauma care system (*discussion*)
Questions related to the playground falls presentations:
 1. What funding resources are there?
 - a. Larger funds for new playgrounds, some local funds with sporting stores, funding through fundraisers with PTO/PTA, community funds
 - b. Surfacing and maintenance is important to consider during updates.
 2. What, is any, programming has occurred around home playgrounds?
 - a. Based on the data, ages 5-9 falls were most commonly occurring during the school day, so efforts and funds were focused on schools
 - b. Previously, there has been a bin demonstration of different surfacing which could be useful to the home playground side of things (not funded)

3. Is there any assessment of safe playgrounds statewide with locations?
 - a. No mapping of safe playgrounds
 - b. Resources out there for audits/assessments that can even be student led

Question regarding injury prevention related to rental standing e scooters. Region 6 antidotally is seeing an increase in these injuries.
