3. Injury Prevention and Death Review Initiatives Presentation with Children's Health Alliance (*Informational*)  
Information presented by Natasha Horst from Children's Health Alliance  
Statewide organization based on national models. Shared the top causes of deaths for youth in Wisconsin. Share that for every 1 cause of death there is 9 admission to the hospital and 540 ED visits, so while they are trying to prevent death, also preventing the admissions and ED visits is critical.  
Child Death Review (CDR): County or regional multidisciplinary team, professional process, looking for opportunities to improve the health and safety of children in WI. It is not peer review, an examine of individual performance, or an opportunity to second guess. Began in 2006 in Wisconsin.
