	DHS Updates	Tami Horzewski		 Tami Horzewski shared the following DHS Updates: Dr. Gary Kirk resigned as Chief Medical Officer and Umbrella Committee chair at DHS. This position is currently vacant. CPT IA and SMA were added by rule to the Newborn Screening panel of conditions in early January 2020.



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		 Pompe Disease was nominated for addition to the Newborn Screening panel of conditions. Pompe is currently being reviewed through the nomination process and has been recommended for addition by the Secretary's Advisory Committee on Newborn Screening (SACNBS). The SACNBS is preparing a report for the Secretary for final recommendation. If Pompe is recommended for addition to the panel it will need to go through the rule writing process.
		 A nomination for review of Krabbe Disease was recently submitted and is moving through the review process. Krabbe was nominated previously in 2015 and relooked at by the metabolic subcommittee in 2017 as well. DHS has been busy managing the COVID-19 response and several administrative staff are currently working in this role, including the DHS administrator/state health officer.



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2019 Screening Summary	Dr. Baker	Dr. Baker presented the 2019 NBS summary for CH and CAH. There were 62,424 Wisconsin born infants screened in 2019, and 54 CH infants and 3 CAH infants were identified.
Update on Recommendations to Stop Screening Samples from Premies after 90 days	Dr. Baker	Dr. Baker shared the data on NBS frequency in the extended hospital stay infants. Compared to the previous data before the new recommendation, there are noticeable decreased numbers of repeated NBS after 90 days in the infants with birthweight less than 2000g since early September, 2019, when the new recommendation was implemented. This information indicates that hospitals are following the new recommendation.
Update on Second Tier Testing for CAH	Dr. Held	Dr. Held provided laboratory values on an interesting case of CAH detected by NBS, possibly due to 3BHSD deficiency. Literature suggests that patients with 3BHSD may have elevated 17OHP. Dr. Held also discussed with the committee her next steps for updating CAH screening algorithms.
