The SACNBS is preparing<br/>a report for the Secretary for final<br/>recommendation. If Pompe is<br/>recommended for addition to the panel<br/>it will need to go through the rule<br/>writing process.</li> </ul> |

|  |  | <ul> <li>A nomination for review of Krabbe<br/>Disease was recently submitted and is<br/>moving through the review process.<br/>Krabbe was nominated previously in<br/>2015 and relooked at by the metabolic<br/>subcommittee in 2017 as well.</li> <li>DHS has been busy managing the<br/>COVID-19 response and several<br/>administrative staff are currently<br/>working in this role, including the DHS<br/>administrator/state health officer.</li> </ul>   |



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| 2019 Screening Summary   | Dr. Baker | Dr. Baker presented the 2019 NBS summary for<br>CH and CAH. There were 62,424 Wisconsin<br>born infants screened in 2019, and 54 CH<br>infants and 3 CAH infants were identified.  |

| Update on Recommendations to Stop<br>Screening Samples from Premies after 90<br>days | Dr. Baker | Dr. Baker shared the data on NBS frequency in<br>the extended hospital stay infants. Compared to<br>the previous data before the new<br>recommendation, there are noticeable<br>decreased numbers of repeated NBS after 90<br>days in the infants with birthweight less than<br>2000g since early September, 2019, when the<br>new recommendation was implemented. This<br>information indicates that hospitals are following<br>the new recommendation. |
| Update on Second Tier Testing for CAH  | Dr. Held  | Dr. Held provided laboratory values on an<br>interesting case of CAH detected by NBS,<br>possibly due to 3BHSD deficiency. Literature<br>suggests that patients with 3BHSD may have<br>elevated 17OHP.<br>Dr. Held also discussed with the committee her<br>next steps for updating CAH screening<br>algorithms.   |
