Child Care Coordination (CCC)



CCC is a current fee for service benefit (FH Topic #980) that helps a member and, when appropriate, the member's family gain access to and coordinate a full array of services, including necessary medical, social, educational, and other services.

Current CCC Benefit

- Available for children who receive initial CCC risk assessment in Milwaukee County up to age 7 and City of Racine up to age 2
- **Goals:** promote positive parenting, improve child health outcomes, and prevent child abuse and neglect.
- **Services:** Assessment; Care plan development; ongoing care coordination and monitoring
- CCC providers are enrolled as PNCC providers



CCC Project: Why

- Wisconsin is working to overcome inequalities in health outcomes.
- Increased access to quality, coordinated health services promotes successful care which results in more equitable health outcomes for maternal and infant/child members.
- Medicaid beneficiaries and care providers are facing greater clinical and health system complexity.
- CCC providers are largely community-based, serve members in-home and community and have local relationships to culturally appropriate resources
- Enhance provider enrollment requirements for benefit integrity purposes.

CCC Redesign: What's Changing?

Updating ForwardHealth Policy and Administrative Rule to:

1. Enhance provider qualifications to be specific to CCC services,
2. Improve covered services policy,
3. Distinguish CCC from other care coordination benefits,
4. Support requirements to help mitigate benefit fraud, waste, and abuse.

CCC Redesign: What's Coming?

- Administrative Rule Updates to DHS 105 (Provider Certification) and DHS 107 (Covered Services)
- State Plan Amendment update
- CCC providers will be available through managed care networks in 2025
- ForwardHealth Update and Handbook revisions
- Enhanced CCC provider resources, including professional development trainings
