Presentation: Baby Badger Network	Jessica Scott Schoerer	Presentation attached. Key points: When genetics started, depended on phenotyping. As time has gone along, testing has improved. Karyotype (pieces of a chromosome missing or extra), Sanger Sequencing (looking at one single gene), Chromosomal Microarray (looking very closely at extra or missing material), and now can look at several or all of the genes to see if they can find a genetic diagnosis. Exome or Genome (preferred) sequencing is now the standard of care in the NICU. Studies have been released demonstrating that testing in an NICU provides higher diagnostic rates, and therefore, improved management of care. We need to do more to ensure access of genomic testing for everyone. Wisconsin challenges and considerations: limited genetic services (4 locations with pediatric geneticists, 3 with pediatric genetic counselors), geography, healthcare landscape, insurance (lots of state, local, and national plans). In 2021, exome sequencing started to be covered by WI Medicaid (only on an outpatient basis).

		 State Programs for rGS (Baby Bear, Baby Manatee, and Baby Deer). R stands for rapid. Funding through Advancing a Healthier Wisconsin grant. Pilot study runs through December 2024. Participants are St. Vincent Hospital and Aurora BayCare in GB. Cigna and UHC are providing some coverage for rGS. Some states have new coverage for rGS (not WI). Next Steps: evaluation and expansion to more NICU sites. Looking for funding for further work. Applying for funding this fall from Advancing a Healthier WI – longer term and more expansive.

SSM has their data ready to go but has had a staff turnover, so we need to take a step back for training. All health systems have been asked to go back to 2020 to submit data. SSM has that data prepared. Isabella is going to update an article for the Wisconsin Medical Journal on WBDR. DHS completed the Statement of Scope on Admin Rule 116. JCRAR did not request a preliminary public hearing. The Secretary did sign the scope. Kaitlin to meet with the legal team again to create a work plan for continuing to move forward. CYSHCN Unit Director has identified some funding to hire a part-time contract position to support the work of the birth defect program. Position description being written.
