1. The meeting was called to order at 10:03 a.m. by Co-Chair Brett Large, in conformity with the Wisconsin Open Meeting Law.

- 2. Attendees introduced themselves. Mr. Smith record attendance. A quorum was present.
- 3. The committee reported that the roster is current. The appropriate contractor association will nominate an additional Employer member to balance the committee.
- 4. Action: The committee approved the minutes as written.

5. Discussions

a. Follow-up questions to the BAS Directors' Call with State Committees

The state committee asked how other committees receive the call. Mr. Smith replied that the committees appreciate the call itself and the fact that it streamlines their respective meetings.

The state committee reported that it appreciates the call because it presents topics that are good to know ever if they do not apply immediately, and offers an opportunity to hear from different trades.

b. How is industry preparing for infrastructure projects?

Director Polk explained that the Department is researching how apprenticeship occupations are preparing for potential infrastructure projects.

The state committee reported that it has not learned of any forthcoming projects or training needs. Instead, local committees continue to expand recruitment in collaboration with high schools, community-based organizations, non-profits, and marketing firms. Recruitment and retainment continues to be an enduring challenge in the rural northern areas of the state; manufacturers now pay a starting wage higher than that of a first-year apprentice. However, the local committees hired a marketing firm to help with advertisement.

c. Reimbursements for on-the-job learning and supportive services

Director Polk reviewed the flier in the meeting material and encouraged attendees to inform their apprentices.

The state committee asked what an employer must do to receive the on-the-job learning reimbursement. Mr. Polk replied that the apprentice must work for the employer for 90 days and provide the documentation. He noted that the reimbursement is a one-time occurrence per apprentice; if the employer receives the reimbursement and the apprentice transfers, the second employer is not eligible for the reimbursement.

d. Register your event for National Apprenticeship Week

Attendees did not have questions or comments.

e. Other

Director Polk thanked the state committee to contributing to Wisconsin Apprenticeship surpass 15,000 apprentices statewide for the second time in its history.

- 6. The state committee confirmed the participant report is accurate. Members stated that the historical report is very helpful for apprenticeship coordinators to consider causes and conditions for increases and decreases in participation.
- 7. The meeting adjourned at 10:45 a.m. The Bureau will schedule the next meeting via electronic survey.


