Aisha gave a brief rundown of the meeting with the SO on 4/28 where PHC leadership shared efforts to engage in state budget

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process, including statement at the Joint Committee on Finance's (JFC) hearing.

The group reviewed the drafted Medicaid Support statement from the PHC (see above). No concerns or suggestions were provided for additional updates/edits by the EC so this will be shared with the appropriate targets (leads of JFC and leadership of Assembly and Senate, as well as their staffers). This would also be shared with other boards and councils within Wisconsin to help amplify this message or to sign on to or to use for any statements they might also want to make. One suggestion was to also include/send to our federal representation within the House and Senate. Also, the group discussed the possibility of a press release or to share this with members of the media for visibility. Press release process would likely require a broader conversation or discussion as right now the PHC is not set up for that particular action and a discussion with DHS to develop a possible process for this would be worthwhile (perhaps discuss with SO?).

WPHA/WALHDAB Conference Session

The group discussed the WPHA/WALHDAB conference session for the PHC. The session went well and it was very well attended, both in-person and online. Many already had heard of the council but it was helpful for folks to know what the council is focused on. There were several opportunities for connection and follow-up both



			during and after the session. Some suggestions provided for future engagement included invitations to upcoming meetings, provided contact information, opportunities to lift up needs within the Issues Committee. PHC could reconsider resurrecting the online form for submission of issues to the PHC, though information flow and how it gets incorporated into the Issues Committee actions, monitoring of submissions, etc would need to be considered. The link to the form, which also includes links to forms both in Spanish and Hmong can be found here. The discussion continued on, to consider future ways to solicit input on issues or areas of focus for the council. Thinking of targeted options for gathering input—like blurbs for gatherings for local public health officer connections, as an example, could be good opportunities for PHC's continued work. And, methods of getting the word out on the actions the PHC is taking to amplify its work, such as a GovD for a variety of stakeholders is interesting. There was a suggestion to add 15 minutes to the upcoming PHC agenda to seek input from the council on some of these considerations. Walk-Ons Next PHC in-person meeting is in October. Consideration of ideas for where this could happen would be a good idea. One suggestion was to consider having this with a Tribal partner, such as with the Ho-Chunk Nation in Black River Falls—can follow up with Sarah T. on this. If not, Lieske also offered to host in Eau Claire as an option.

Opportunities for walking through what key themes are emerging and having a discussion of what this means and what is needed for the council.

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			 Currently working on standing up the SHP Committee, including Jules Lee, Sarah Kohlbeck, and Laura Scudiere from the council in representation on that committee. Have also been working with Badger Bay/WPHA/WALHDAB of identifying additional public health perspectives to include here and to establish a strong connect with our other statewide agencies. Perhaps there could also connect to the CHA/CHIP/SHA/SHIP CoP or the CHNA Committee/Workgroup in WPHA or the Policy and Advocacy Committee. Also consider the Milwaukee County Healthcare Partnership. Maggie is also looking for regional community organizational representation on this committee. Paula reiterated the point that there is latitude for the SHP committee to identify folks directly that they think would be important to incorporate. There was also conversation about how the SHA and SHIP are communicated for awareness, visibility, and action. Maggie spoke about how this is communicated via press and direct sharing with both key stakeholders (governor and legislature, among other groups) and with the public. Discussion could be on how to keep these stakeholders more in the loop throughout the process. Will be sharing the final letter of support from PHEPAC for preparedness funding to the PHC, share high-level strategic plan objectives, and discuss what contingency plans can be made should federal funding be cut. Given that almost all funding for preparedness is federal and the administration seeks to shift that responsibility to the states, this is a significant area of concern.
