#### **Draft Meeting Minutes**

- **1.** Darren Johnson called the meeting to order at 10:05 a.m. in conformance with the Wisconsin open meeting laws.
- **2.** Attendees introduced themselves. Attendance was recorded in the table above. A quorum was present.

#### 3. Review Roster

 Several changes were noted for the roster. The correct phone number for Brenda Egli is 608-698-9077. Change Darren Johnson to WI NECA. Remove the fax number for Dean Miller. Ryan Kastanek will be replaced shortly per Kelly.

#### 4. Review and Approve Previous Meeting Minutes

- Update minutes to include that Sean Frank was present at the last meeting. Correct Jesse's Local # to 158 (not 518) on the attendance roster.
- Kelly Tourdot made a motion to approve the minutes as amended. Sean seconded the motion. Motion passed.

#### 5. Specific Committee Items for Discussion (Public Comment)

a. Review of Exhibit A – Update: The BAS proposed that the entire committee work collaboratively to revise one Exhibit A starting with the work processes. Lynn outlined a structured framework (dacum) for the process, estimating it would take 1–2 hours. Forming a sub-committee of industry subject experts was recommended as well as revising the Exhibit A before making instructional changes. Sean motioned to create a sub-committee; Kelly seconded the motion, which carried.

The sub-committee consists of: Sean Frank, Kelly Tourdot, Zach Newton, Brenda Egli, Jim Cook, Mike Wagner, Sam Everly, Michael McDonald, Cheyenne, Ryan's replacement and Dan Large from local 494 in Milwaukee. Lynn will share the systematic review process. Sub-committee meetings will be scheduled by BAS and facilitated by WIDS.

- **b. 5-year Instructional Review-WIDS:** Following the Exhibit A review, the committee will begin their cyclical review of related instruction for any potential revisions.
- c. Follow-Up Discussion on PRI Contract Hours and Absences: The BAS requested the removal of the 90% attendance requirement from the state standards. Attendance policies are a local committee item and no other trade has attendance language in their state standard. In addition, this policy allows for potential violations of local committees in allowing apprentices to complete below the contract-required PRI. The industry members present agreed that the 400-hour minimum is too low and should be addressed during the re-evaluation of the Exhibit A. Liz confirmed that at this time there are no state programs currently that have less than 576 PRI hours required for electricians. The topic was tabled for further review

and will be added to the spring agenda.

#### 6. Director's Call Discussion

- No one had any follow up questions to the call.
- National Apprenticeship Week is November 17-23 this year. Please have NAW events posted on the DOL website to spread awareness. Please send requests to David and/or Liz for a BAS representative at your event.
- Save the date for the Biennial Conference on February 19-21, 2025 at the Kalahari. Agenda details are still being developed but there will be a TAG session from approximately 10 am – 2:30 am as well as an evening social. Donations or sponsorships are appreciated. This year WRTP and the Milwaukee Urban League will be assisting greatly. If interested, message Liz and/or David.

#### 7. WTCS Update

- Jamie Bernthal reminded everyone the Tools of the Trade scholarship is active and apprentices are eligible for up to \$2000 per year. The deadline to apply is November 22<sup>nd</sup>. Jamie will research the process for announcing awarded scholarships at the schools.
- Ascendium, who hosts TOTT, is offering \$100 stipends to interested apprentices to be involved in sharing their experience and opinions. They should email Jamie Bernthal if interested.

#### 8. Other Discussion Items

- DSPS and Pearson Vue testing process concerns. Jim Cook said they spoke with Sarah Berry at the DSPS. They shared their primary concerns: lack of notice regarding allowed testing resources/materials and the inconsistent application of test administration throughout the state. They shared 6 additional resources with the DSPS for their consideration to allow in the testing room going forward. Sarah Berry acknowledged their concerns and agreed to consider their input on permissible resources. Details for a virtual DSPS/Pearson Vue informational meeting on 10/15/24 were shared with the entire committee. The committee will be drafting a letter to David Polk and the DSPS that they would like David to elevate for further attention on this issue. Discussion was also had regarding having the DSPS attend a portion of the electrical state committee meetings in the future.
- John Walsh reported some challenges receiving hours verifications from the Northwoods electrical committee for transferring apprentices. The concern is that the hours are being sent from the apprentice rather than the committee. Liz advised that if their ATR isn't able to help with this issue then they should elevate it to Ben Stahlecker.

#### 9. Electrical Program Participation

• Data on the electrical program participation was reviewed. Mike Wagner questioned the relevance of showing union vs. non-union data and if it is useful or accurate. Liz noted the BAS does not specifically ask individuals about their union status but the data is populated based on the status of the local committee being signatory or not. This data has always been provided but changes can be made to the language or possibly eliminate it from the

report if desired.

- **10.** The next meeting will be April 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2025 at 1:00 p.m. Liz Pusch will send out a save the date.
- **11.** The committee adjourned at 11:56 a.m. following a motion made by Zach and seconded by Kelly.

#### MEMORANDUM:

The requirement of wages paid for time spent in related instruction is included in the apprentice contract as prescribed in WI Stat 106 and DWD Chapter 295:

<u>Wisconsin Statute 106.01(6)(a)</u>: An employer shall pay an apprentice for the time that the apprentice is receiving related instruction as provided in this paragraph. An employer shall pay an apprentice for not less than the number of hours of related instruction specified in par. (b) or the number of hours of related instruction specified in the apprentice contract, whichever is greater, at the same rate per hour as the employer pays the apprentice for services performed.

<u>DWD Chapter 295.07(3)(g)</u>: [The apprentice contract shall contain, explicitly or by reference] A statement of the graduated scale of wages to be paid to the apprentice and whether or not the required related instruction is compensated.

As the requirements of the apprentice contract are prescribed in state statute and subsequent administrative rule, additional "side" agreements that would nullify the requirements of the apprentice contract are not legally enforceable.

In the specific instance of required paid related instruction wages, an employer or sponsor cannot establish an additional agreement to recoup such wages in the instance of an apprentice leaving employment.

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
