- 1. The meeting was called to order at 1:03 p.m. by Mr. Owen Smith in conformity with the Wisconsin Open Meeting Law.
- 2. Attendance was recorded. A quorum was present.
- 3. The committee reviewed the current roster.

#### 4. Actions

#### a. Elect Co-Chairs

The state committee elected Darren Johnson as Employer Co-Chair and Sean Frank as Employee Co-Chair.

#### b. Approve the minutes.

The state committee approved the minutes as revised: Jim Cook was not present; and Kelly Tourdot will submit a revision to the discussion of ModuMath.

#### c. Math requirements for applicants

The focus group reported that it did not have an update due to an apparent confusion over the the next steps. The focus group stated it was awaiting recommendations from the Wisconsin Technical College; Nancy Nakkoul stated the WTCS provided recommendations to the focus group in September.

Nancy Nakkoul reiterated that the WTCS compiled recommend courses, both system-wide and individual to local colleges, that could be customized to the individual learner based on Accuplacer scores or occupational competencies.

Jim Cook and Kelly Tourdot reiterated that the focus group has three concerns: applicants need a strong foundation in algebra; required preparatory courses should be low-to-no cost to the applicant and considered separately from assessments, such as Accuplacer, which some local committees do not use.

Nancy welcomed to meet again with the focus group to review the numerous WTCS algebra courses and variations that could be customized into low-to-no-cost options for learners.

Kelly recommended that the focus group conclude discussions within the month and present a recommendation to the state committee at its 2023 spring meeting.

#### d. Direct Entry

Deputy Director Pusch reviewed that the current policies for direct entry and direct interview in all construction state standards apply to veterans only because they were implemented by the federal and state Helmet to Hardhats initiative. Since then, the revised CFR 29.30 allowed for broader selection procedures, including direct entry and direct interview for broader categories of applicants. The revised CFR 29.30 will be implemented into the revised Wisconsin Apprenticeship Manual.

She noted that the Bureau will seek industry input on whether state committees should determine direct entry policies or leave them the discretion of local committees.

Mrs. Pusch concluded that the Bureau will table the discussions and review of state and local direct entry policies until the *Manual* is revised and the Bureau can gather industry input.

#### 5. Discussions

#### a. Questions from the Directors' Call with State Committees

Attendees did not have follow-up questions regarding agenda items from the Directors' Call.

#### b. How is industry preparing for potential infrastructure projects?

Director Polk asked attendees how potential infrastructure projects might affect their workforce and training needs, such as increasing hiring, bidding on specialized projects, or acquiring specific materials.

The state committee agreed that potential projects would require standard tasks and materials included in the program but acquiring standard materials has been challenging due to supply chain issues. Also, industry is somewhat hesitant about special projects, such as solar and electric vehicle infrastructure, because the initial demand may lead to additional hiring but the work soon dries up.

#### c. Reimbursement for on-the-job learning and supportive services

Director Polk reviewed the services and qualifications and encouraged attendees to pursue them.

Attendees did not have questions or comments.

d. Register your National Apprenticeship Week event with the U.S. Department of Labor Director Polk reviewed the national event calendar and encouraged attendees to participate.

Attendees did not have questions or comments.

#### e. Other

Attendees expressed concern that the apprentice contract no longer includes the apprentice contract number; employers need the contract number to determine wages on Davis-Bacon projects.

Director Polk acknowledged the concern and ensured attendees that the Bureau has been researching solutions with its information technology department.

6. The committee adjourned at 2:25 p.m. The Bureau will schedule the next meeting via online survey.
