- Kilah Engelke nominated Natalie Young as employer co-chair. Jim Vick seconded. All voted in favor.

#### 5. Specific Committee Items for Discussion (Public Comment)

• High School Diploma Requirement – BAS reviewed current state standards minimum qualifications and sought feedback from the committee regarding trades deciding to remove high school diploma as an RA entry requirement. It was noted that committees can always maintain the high school diploma requirement as it would exceed state minimums. Though generally in favor of making changes some committee members expressed concerns regarding transferability amongst the trades if the entry requirements become so different. BAS suggested that if the high school diploma requirement is removed, a qualifying test like Accuplacer should be included. The committee asked if they could include both the high school diploma requirement and testing could be added as an "either or" option for committees to adopt. BAS will provide suggested language incorporating either a diploma or testing requirement for review before the fall meeting.

Kilah Engelke motion to table topic to fall – Bill Bonlender seconded. Motion approved.

• Wage Repayment Agreements - BAS provided an overview of recent concerns with sponsors and employers requiring apprentices to sign wage repayment agreements that could affect them in the instance of leaving employment with their assigned employer either within the course of their apprenticeship or after completion. BAS shared a memo that was issued in Feb 2024 outlining the statutory requirement of paid related instruction and the prohibition of requiring the repayment of contract-required PRI. The Advisory Council discussed this item at the February 2025 meeting and subsequently approved language for addition to the WI Apprenticeship Manual to clarify this. Notification will be provided when the Manual update is completed. Sponsors or employers can reach out to BAS for assistance in complying with this requirement, if needed.
