			2024 AHS-Flyer-final-Dr.Gilr Dr Gilmore shared information about the 29 th Annual Adolescent Health Symposium, which is a virtual event being held by the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse, focused on community agency reps, educators, health and human service professionals, health education specialists, school administrators, school psychologists, and youth workers: https://www.uwlax.edu/ex/ahs. A recording will be made and will be shared with the PHC. Lieske Giese also highlighted two hospital facilities closing in the Western Region of the state, which is a crisis in this area with a significant loss in care for adolescents, psychology, rural clinics, gynecological care, etc. This is a moving situation but there is a significant population impact and crisis potential. Lieske expressed concern that this may be a precursor to other areas and suggests that the PHC should have this on its radar.
9:10 – 9:15 (5 Minutes)	Election	Bill Keeton, Chair	 Action item: vote Transition to new Chair, & elect new Secretary Bill Keeton provided updates about changes in the composition of officers to PHC. Terry Brandenburg will be ending his term as Past Chair, and Paula Morgen will be moving to the Chair position. Bill also provided thanks to Joan Theurer for serving again as Secretary. Without a nominee for the Chair-elect position, a motion was moved by Alan Schwartzstein to hold the seat open until a nominee can be identified for a vote at the next meeting. Dr Gilmore provided a second and the motion carries unanimously. For now, the Executive Committee will be reduced to three members until a Chair-elect can be identified.



			During elections, Bob Leischow gave a statement on his candidacy for the Secretary position, reflecting on his role as a member of the PHC for many years and as a health officer for the City of West Allis Health Department. The PH Council members then completed a vote for Secretary. After vote, Bob Leischow was elected as Secretary. Maggie Northrop began the presentation from MC4JR grantees by providing an introduction to the State Health Plan and the connection to community work by three grantees (City on a Hill, Hmong and Hispanic Communication Network Project, ABC for Health) presenting to the PHC for awareness of what's happening in the community and what's being done at the local level in alignment with the SHIP (particularly with regard to social connectedness), with funding from the CDC Health Disparities Grant. LaTonya Hughes (MC4JR Grant Manager) and Lilli Minor (MC4JR Community Liaison) then gave an introduction of the program and the work of the grantees through the CDC HD grant, as well as the purpose of the grant in general. 11:00 – 11:30 (30 Minutes)	Discussion and vote: Adopt an action item related to Social Connectedness & Belonging Presentation	Maggie Northrop, Support Staff	 Following the Deep Dive of the SHIP Priority Area Social Connectedness and Belonging, Council members identified potential action items. Statement for the PHC (Social Connecter Maggie Northrop shared a document highlighting a statement for the PHC around social connectedness and potential proposed solutions and recommendations (see above). Questions/recommendations from the PHC: Dedicated funding/support for social connectedness efforts Data related to social connectedness should also be available at smaller jurisdictional levels. Public health can assist with compiling data and information and can provide experience and subject matter expertise for upstream conditions leading to health outcomes/health disparities. There is a need to include accountability pieces directed towards PHC, state, and community. Recommendations to advance social connection and belonging presented ties nicely to discussion earlier on social justice grants, a resolution is needed for this.



			 Current MCH funds at the local health department level does include social connections as an optional objective—is there a way to leverage that funding for support of this work? There are also many organizations in the APHA that may assist with finding funding and providing insight as well. Need to be more specific with root cause influencers using evidence and literature. Can also lean on other states for insights here. Housing and zoning policies also create barriers to connection in an open, very intentional manner. Hoping housing/segregation/racism are part of the conversations. Social connectedness can be related to built environment. Is public health at the table for city/county planning? We tend to not look at this planning through the entire health lens Financial investments should be included in the resolution how much is already (or not) invested in this area?

Aisha Dogbey gave updates on the JEDI committee, including highlighting "position descriptions" for possible community members to join this group. Bob Leischow also gave an update on the Issues Committee/Public Health Nursing Workgroup. The group is working on recruiting participants for addressing the PHN issue and have compiled a survey to distribute to compile information about experience on this issue. Membership committee is being formulated. A group (Aisha Dogbey, Joan Theurer, Sarah Thryselius) are starting to meet to charter this subcommittee.
