- 1. The meeting was called to order at 10:03 a.m. by Mr. Owen Smith in conformance with the Wisconsin open meeting laws.
- 2. Attendees introduced themselves. Mr. Owen Smith recorded attendance. A quorum was present.
- 3. The committee recommended the following revisions to the roster: Mr. Neuhauser replaced Mr. Driebel from Local 669; Mr. Klug changed employers.

4. Actions

a. The committee approved the minutes as written.

b. The committee approved Mr. Kobb as Employee Co-Chair.

5. Discussions

a. Questions on topics in BAS Director's Call with State Committees

Mr. Smith reviewed that the Director's Call discusses apprenticeship-wide topics with all state committees in a single forum to streamline each committee's meeting to its own programs and policies. This agenda topic will reoccur to provide each committee the opportunity to ask questions of the Call, if needed.

Attendees did not have questions or comments.

Director Polk encouraged attendees to host events for National Apprenticeship and register them with the U.S. Department of Labor for inclusion in the national calendar of events. <u>He shared this link in the chat.</u>

b. On-the-Job Learning Reimbursements

Director Polk reviewed the flier included in the meeting material and encouraged sponsors to request reimbursement. The reimbursements do not have a wage requirement; they apply to all apprentices.

Attendees did not have questions or comments.

c. How is industry preparing for infrastructure projects?

Director Polk asked attendees whether the forthcoming federal funding for infrastructure projects will affect their occupation and, if so, how sponsors will prepare.

The state committee replied that infrastructure projects will indirectly affect the occupation, e.g. the projects may require sprinkler systems underground or for tangential bus or train terminals. The current workforce is sufficient for the possible demand.

d. Other

Mr. Klug asked when the 90-day public comment period for the *Wisconsin Apprenticeship Manual* ends. Mr. Smith replied that it concludes today, September 20. Mr. Polk explained that the Bureau will present the comments to the Advisory Council's Policy & Standards Subcommittee, which will recommend final revisions for approval to the full Advisory Council during its November meeting.

Co-Chair Sferra asked when the state committee will review its state standards. Mr. Smith replied that the state committee will review the updated boilerplate language at its 2023 spring meeting; the boilerplate language will come from the approved *Manual*. Mr. Smith noted that the minimum standards set by the state committee remain at the committee's discretion to review and revise.


