1. The meeting was called to order at 10:03 a.m. by August Hoppe, Committee Co-Chair, in conformance with the Wisconsin Open Meeting Law.
2. Attendees introduced themselves. Mr. Owen Smith, recorded attendance.
3. The committee reviewed the current roster. A quorum was present. Wes Freeland joined the committee. Tim Harris is now with SavATree; Ben Reince will serve as an Employer representative. The Bureau will recruit additional members.

4. Action

a. Approve the minutes.

The state committee approved the minutes as written.

b. Develop or revise curriculum to prepare apprentices for ISA Certified Arborist Exam

Mr. Smith reviewed that the statewide Exhibit A, established by the state committee, does not require apprentices to obtain third-party certifications. Instead, the certifications are at the discretion of the sponsor. However, some employers have chosen to require their apprentices to obtain the ISA Certified Arborist, so the state committee had revisited whether to require the certification or continue to leave it optional but enhance the related instruction to further prepare apprentices for it.

Direct Polk explained that the Plumbing State Committee implemented a mandatory review course on the plumbing code to prepare apprentices for the plumbing licensing exam.

The state committee discussed the advantages and disadvantages of requiring the certification and enhancing the related instruction with the ISA preparatory course or a review course.

Nancy Nakkoul clarified that the plumbing review course is unpaid related instruction and a preparatory course for the licensing exam is available once the apprentice completes all requirements of the program.

Representatives of Milwaukee Area Technical College offered to explore resequencing the existing related instruction to better prepare apprentices who may be required by their sponsor to take the exam.

***Action:** the state committee approved a motion to keep the ISA Certified Arborist credential at the discretion of the sponsor.*

***Action:** the state committee supported exploring options to resequence the current related instruction without developing new content.*

5. Discussions

a. BAS Director's Call with State Committees

Attendees did not have questions or comments.

b. How is the industry preparing for infrastructure projects?

Director Polk asked the state committee whether the tree care industry is preparing for potential infrastructure projects.

The state committee replied that the industry is neither anticipating nor planning for such projects because most contractors do not work on projects that require large-scale land clearing for roads.

c. Reimbursements for on-the-job learning and supportive services

Director Polk reviewed the flier in the meeting packet, including the eligibility requirements.

The state committee asked whether municipalities and out-of-state contractors would be eligible. Director Polk explained that both entities may encounter complications. He encouraged the state committee to contact the program administrators listed on the flier for additional information.

d. Register National Apprenticeship Week events with the U.S. Department of Labor

Director Polk encouraged attendees to host events and, this year, register them through the new website. Attendees did not have questions or comments.

e. Other

The state committee proposed reducing the length of the registered apprenticeship because completing three years of content takes longer than three years, due to other work commitments and lack of overtime. Mr. Smith and Mr. Polk noted that construction occupations have similar provisions for seasonal work. They welcomed discussing the matter further.

***Action:** the Bureau asked the state committee to convene a focus group to propose revisions at the spring meeting. Mr. Smith asked the focus group to submit the initial draft to him or Mr. Nick Abbott prior to the spring meeting for review.*

A consultant asked whether the technical colleges could offer a CDL course more specific to the Arborist occupation. Arborists need a CDL Class A for trucks and chippers, but many Class A courses include many other Class A vehicles not used by Arborists, such as big rigs, which are unnecessary for Arborists.

Mr. Dave Stuart and Mr. Elton Rogers offered to research options. Ms. Nakkoul added that several occupations have inquired similarly; she recommended that the Bureau, WTCS and multiple occupations have a broader conversation about entry-level driving training.

6. Review the participant data.

The state committee did not have questions or comments about the participant reports. Director Polk and Mr. Smith congratulated the state committee on contributing to Wisconsin Apprenticeship surpassing 15,000 apprentices for only the second time in its history.

7. The meeting adjourned at 11:30 a.m. The Bureau will schedule the next meeting via electronic survey.
