Pamela (Pam) Guthman was invited to speak to the Public Health Council as the original submitter of the request that was prioritized within the Issues Committee's review process.

Public Health Nursing Workgroup Lead, Pam Guthman gave a broader background on the specific request pertaining to public health nursing as well as her background in nursing practice. Pam included a presentation to give an overview of public health nursing and the proposed topic.

This background included a history of public health nursing, the connection to the state health plan, social determinants of health and health disparities, nursing workforce shortages and challenges—particularly in public health nursing and connecting nursing practice and workforce investments to advancements in health as well as health equity work.

Following the presentation, the Council engaged in a robust conversation, providing feedback and questions about the workgroup's development, the potential product to emerge from the workgroup, and more. Council members discussed the importance of working through a health equity lens, and an alignment with the SHIP and current work in this area. All feedback, questions and concerns will be shared with potential members of the Public Health Nursing Workgroup.

9:55—10:55 (60 Minutes)	SHIP Update: Summary of 8/4 conversation & Proposed Role of the Public Health Council Process Formalization: Status Update PHEP-AC Chair	Bill Keeton, Chair	 The Council engaged in conversation about the proposed role of the Public Health Council. Points of conversation included: A central component of the charge of the PHC is advising the Governor, Legislature, and DHS Secretary. The focus should remain on aligning priority areas and foundational shifts of the State Health Plan and/or preparedness to any collective action. The Council should consider collective efficacy to bring together collection action to address systems-related issues. The Public Health Council may need to consider how big/broad or more focused should solicited issues be. An update to the PHEP-AC chair role was shared. The current chair stepped down and Mary Dorn is the interim chair until another chair of the committee can be identified.
10:55—11:10 (15 minutes)	State Health Plan Update	Maggie Northrop, Support Staff	A brief update was provided on the SHIP. The SHIP implementation report is currently in the final stages of internal review within DHS and will be shared once approved. The State Health Plan team is also working on a mapping project of state boards and councils in Wisconsin and the roles that they play in addressing the identified priority areas, to help enhance broad collaboration and coordination for PHC to engage with these other groups. The State Health Plan team is excited to engage with the Council in deep dives around the SHP priority areas and will likely focus first on housing as a pilot to test how these engagements and advising will operate.

11:35—12:15 (40 Minutes)	Nominations Committee Chair Elect & Secretary Positions Information on the nominating and election process Taking applications for Nominations Committee Reminder all Council members are encouraged to be involved in a subcommittee.	Bill Keeton, Chair	Public Health Council Chair, Bill Keeton described the nomination process and initiated a discussion around elections for the two officer roles within the PHC that are elected every two years, specifically the Chair-Elect and the Secretary. The Chair appoints the nominating committee that solicits candidates for the elections. Details about the nominating committee below: Per Bylaws: The Nominating Committee will consist of three members, appointed by the Chair, by November 1st of every odd calendar year. The Committee will then prepare a list of candidates and submit the list to the Council no later than two weeks before the election. Members of the Council who are not on the Nominating Committee may nominate themselves or other Council members. Members of the Nominating Committee may not run for office. Additional nominations may be directed to the Nominating Committee, to be received by that committee no later than thirty (30) days prior to the election. Elections take place at the Annual Meeting and the elected officers will begin their posts in February 2024. Those interested in joining the Nominating Committee should email Bill Keeton (and CC Aisha Dogbey, support staff). Once the

A motion to open was provided by Dr. Gary Gilmore, and Angelique Lewis seconded. A vote to adopt the charter (with expectation that the proposed change is incorporated) was unanimous and the charter is formally approved. Support Staff Maggie Northrop led a group review of the revised operating agreements for the PHC, specifically on the last agreement to incorporate additional feedback and understanding prior to a vote. Council members recommended that the operating agreements group work with JEDI committee members to clearly identify and define "oppressive systems" within the document.
