Chair and Vice-Chair Responsibilities

Set the vision, define and lead the direction and strategy, and its implementation, of the Council's work.

Serve as key contact for members and the non-Council public.

Sets goals and objectives for the work and ensure they are met.

Facilitate bi-monthly and planning meetings with state staff, co-chairs and facilitators.

Advocate for resources and the needs of council.

Serve as key liaison between the council and Wisconsin government.

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Planning Committee Responsibilities

Serve as the backbone structure for the entire council providing work support (i.e., administrative, subject matter, policy and program analysis, governmental relations, resource management, strategic planning, project management, advising, etc.)

Connect the Council with needed resources clearing path and developing structures and processes for those resources to be procured and utilized.

Serve as the key liaison between the council and Wisconsin government (i.e., GO, LtGO, agencies, etc.) and facilitates the flow of information across entities.

Remove barriers, obstacles, roadblocks, mitigate issues that impair the council's ability to move forward successfully.

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Subcommittee Co-Chair Responsibilities

Develop and hold a vision for the subcommittee's work, subcommittee expectations and norms, and outcomes.

Drive subcommittee towards those goals and facilitate decision-making.

Create agendas, schedule and lead meetings at a frequency necessary for the work.

Facilitate communication between planning committee and the subcommittee by serving as a liaison.

Participate in **once-a-month check-ins** with vice-chair and planning committee.

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Facilitator Responsibilities

- Provide backbone support (i.e., administrative, project and workplan development and management, planning, strategy and visioning).
- Support the leadership of their co-chairs through handling scheduling, logistics, handling open meeting and public records, managing records retention, notes and minutes taking.
- Attend **weekly meetings** with the GHEC project manager.
- Attend **once a month meetings** with the vice-chair and planning committee.

GOAL: Develop a set of recommendations that advance **policy** solutions and corrections that address health equity in our state.

Examples:

- Healthcare accessibility
- Failures in government assistance programs/Safety-net pitfalls
- Upstream/preventative policy
- Misalignment in funding between federal/state/local

GOAL: Develop a set of recommendations that advance health equity and combat health inequity in our state through intentional investments in **program** and programmatic solutions and strategies driven by historically and systemically oppressed communities (i.e., EO#17: race and ethnicity, incarceration, economic status, and geography) .

Examples:

- Underinvestment in health-advancing infrastructure (e.g., accessible transit, education centers, community gardens, community health centers, etc.)

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FRAMING: Data, Analytics and Strategy

GOAL: Develop recommendations aimed at targeting gaps in our understanding of health inequity and/or limits to accountability, and lead the development of the data narrative, **framing** of the work and strategy for driving plan buy-in.

Examples:

- Investigate health inequity across race and ethnicity, incarceration, economic status, and geography (EO #17)
- Identify other focus areas and communities
