To whom it may concern,

I would like to share my opinion regarding having veterinarians be eligible for Covid vaccines.

I would encourage you to have small animal emergency room and large animal veterinarians and technicians vaccinated as soon as possible. I recognize that the current recommendations do not include veterinarians in phase 1B. Based on food supply safety concerns, public health concerns (parasites and zoonotic diseases such as rabies and leptospirosis), and acknowledging the human-animal bond I think including at least this subset of veterinarians is important. My personal opinion is that not all veterinarians need to be vaccinated ASAP with such a critical shortage of vaccines but this small group should be for the sake of their safety while they manage issues that affect the public as a whole. Many veterinarians have been able to adapt to some degree with telemedicine (I work fully remote) and changing the way the clinic is managed but large animal veterinarians, particularly dairy veterinarians, and small animal emergency room veterinarians have fewer options available to protect themselves and their staff.

My name is Matt Byers and I am from Dodgeville, Wisconsin. I am a primarily food animal veterinarian. I am writing to ask you to include veterinarian health care professionals in Phase 1b of the Wisconsin COVID-19 vaccination plan.

Our clinic, Military Ridge Veterinary Service SC, is a three doctor mixed animal practice in rural Iowa County, WI. We service, among other things, dairy cattle, beef cattle, small ruminants, pigs, and companion animals. Our clients range from hobby farms to large, modern livestock operations. Winter and spring are very busy times as sheep, goats, and beef cattle are giving birth. Both the birthing process and care for newborns requires a lot of veterinary intervention in order for our clients, producers of food, to remain viable and profitable. If our clinic has to curtail or outright stop providing service, animal health and food safety are jeopardized.

Another reason veterinarians are important is that we are a trusted source of interpreting and disseminating human health information for/to our clients. Rural areas, in general, tend to be more skeptical about the significance of COVID 19. By getting vaccinated ourselves, we are able to demonstrate the importance of getting vaccinated to protect, not only one's own health and business (ie, their farms), but also the public's health.

My name is Megan Arce and I am from Madison, Wisconsin. I am a veterinarian. I am writing to ask you to include veterinarian health care professionals in Phase 1b of the Wisconsin COVID-19 vaccination plan.

I work at a small animal hospital, Lakeview Veterinary Clinic, with approximately 20 employees. We do not have the luxury of working from home. We also are unable to socially distance from each other, due to the nature of our job. I am unable to place an intravenous catheter without a staff member holding the animal, which places us in very close contact. This happens all day long. If one of our employees were to contract covid19, we would likely need to close the clinic for many days, as we would all be exposed. Hundreds of animals would be without care, including life threatening conditions, painful conditions, and end of life procedures. The animal emergency clinics in town are already overwhelmed and do not have the capacity to serve all of the animals that need to be cared for - they are frequently shutting down due to a lack of staff and resources to accommodate all of the sick animals.



I own a small mixed animal veterinary clinic in Chetek WI. Your committee omitted veterinarians and their staff from the list of essential workers. I need to share with you who you are leaving off.

Animals have never cared about clocks or calendars and it turns out they care even less about pandemics. They're still giving birth, getting sick, having accidents, and dying (unfortunately). My staff of nine is available 24/7 to help animals and their owners through these obstacles . We have modified many of our routines to reduce our risks of coronavirus transmission, such as keeping owners in their cars while we care for their pets, postponing non-essential services, and doing virtual medicine when appropriate, which is not often. Back in March, I vowed to my patients, clients, and staff that we would not close our doors as long as one of us was well enough to carry on AND I vowed to my staff and their families that I would do everything in my power to protect them while we cared for patients.

So far, we have been able to avoid Covid but neighboring clinics have not been as lucky. There is not much over-capacity in rural Wisconsin veterinary clinics. If a clinic is forced to shut down, or even reduce capacity, neighboring clinics are going to get squeezed due to overflow - compromising staff safety and patient care.

Frankly, I think veterinarians should have been included in the 1a healthcare worker category but it is not too late to include veterinarians in the 1b designation.

We currently are approximately 60 patients per day and are currently providing curbside service to limit the exposure of our staff to the clients. If our staff was able to be vaccinated we would be able to allow our clients back in the building and be able to provide the level of care that they are accustomed to. If this were to happen we would not be able to provide the appointments needed for the numerous rabies observations that we are seeing weekly. This could provide a very serious issue with the states continued fight against Rabies.

I would like to encourage you to include veterinarians, and their staff, as part of the next phase (1B) of vaccine distribution.

I personally own a small animal clinic, with 4 employees, and we have been doing all we can to provide animal care to our clients, while keeping the clinic open under curbside recommendations.

Covid infection in either myself, or my small staff, would be devastating.

This would:

- 1. force our 2000+ clients/their pets, to seek veterinary care elsewhere for an extended period of time. For patients with medical conditions (such as chemotherapy) which need weekly care, this would be very stressful for their owners and could lead to lapses in their proper care/treatment protocol.
- 2. Place a greater burden on remaining staff, if I have 25-50% of my workforce gone for extended time.
- 3. If I had to be out, there is no opportunity for the clinic to provide service at all.

 and this business is how I provide. I cannot easily absorb a protracted leave of absence, and I worry I would not be able to pay my staff as there would be no revenue coming in.

I would estimate 80% of the clinics in my area are in the same boat as me-- one or two veterinarians, small staff, and no way to remain open if there is a significant covid outbreak. I know of 2 clinics in 2020 which had to close down for 2 weeks, for this reason.



Good morning,

Thank you for all of your efforts in this very challenging time. We greatly appreciate your work and understand that you have a very tough job working with limited resources and enormous demand.

I am the Director of the Wisconsin Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory (WVDL). Our primary mission is to support animal and public health with high quality diagnostic testing and collaboration with state and federal agencies to manage infectious disease outbreaks. I am writing your committee to advocate for my laboratory team to be considered as Tier 1b vaccine candidates for COVID19 vaccination in Dane and Barron Counties.

We are not involved directly with human patient care but are essential for human and animal health care system infrastructure and operations. We were the main manufacturer of COVID19 test kits for Wisconsin until September, 2020. We have also built and maintain a CLIA/CAP approved diagnostic laboratory for human COVID-19 testing with a capacity for 14,000 tests per week to serve UW-Madison and UW-System as needed.

The COVID-19 diagnostic laboratory is embedded within the WVDL facility and team. This was done for efficiency and rapid stand up in an established quality and administrative structure. Some of the staff have received COVID-19 vaccine as Tier 1a because they work directly with human COVID samples. However, for the same reason as non-frontline human health care workers are Tier 1b, we are requesting tier 1b status for the reminder of our staff.

Our entire team was instrumental in rapid detection and management of COVID-19 on mink ranches in Wisconsin. We personally couriered and ran testing out of hours on emergency to diagnose and initiate rapid disease control steps on both of the positive ranches in Wisconsin. This work was critical to stop spread in the largest mink production industry in the world. As with human COVID-19 testing, mink testing is embedded within our team and facility so that we can maintain our ability for rapid, 24/7/365 response.

The WVDL has an essential role in Wisconsin to keep the agricultural industries moving by certifying disease free status, including COVID-19. This includes animals and animal products. As we are entering the highly pathogenic avian influenza season and are maintaining vigilant surveillance for African swine fever, having as much of our staff healthy and ready to respond is a **critical link to maintain Wisconsin Agriculture Industries**.

Our peer laboratories are all either 1a or 1b for vaccine priority. As Level 1 laboratory in the National Animal Health Laboratory Network, we are asking for the same status so we can fulfill our mission to collaboratively work to manage infectious disease outbreaks that can and do occur every year.

COVID-19 management is not limited to diagnostic testing of human and animal samples. WVDL supports management of COVID-19 disease management and risk mitigation with DHS, DATCP, USDA, DNR, and CDC on a daily basis.

Risk of COVID-19 for our team: WVDL has the same risks, or higher based on the CDC work on APIP Work Group for vaccines for non-forward facing COVID-19 staff, because of our work with mink, agriculture, and human COVID-19 diagnostic testing.
