- System Management & Development (Dr. Clark/Chair)
  - o COVID Surveys
    - PPE supplies still a challenge but seem to be steadily to improving; not at crisis levels
    - Training remains a challenge related to social distancing recommendations (more tele-training, minimal hands on) and additional challenges for clinical sites
    - Those reporting staff shortage reported less than 25% of staff out at a time, reasons for missing work evenly
      distributed among varies reasons
    - Minimal reported participation in specimen collection, Flu or COVID vaccination programs
  - o NHTSA EMS COVID Survey Report
    - Still working to get services to submit data on a weekly basis
    - Up to 20-25 services submitting data on good weeks
    - Regional coordinators are starting to follow up with services in their region that report PPE shortages to ensure that they know how to report this need locally in the manner that will funnel into the state requests if the need cannot be met locally.
  - Committee suggested EMS Office consider sending information about survey or other data items to additional leadership contacts within services (CQI Officer, Training Office, etc) to help increase response rates
  - EMS Diversion: Approved by Committee to present to EMS Board for approval to reach out to WI ACEP and WHA to work on statewide position statement

Motion form Committee – to accept the guideline on onboarding Second – Chris Eberlien Discussion Approved – Unanimously

- Pre-Arrival Instructions and PSAP's Project by WEMSA/MCW
  - o Project initially on hold related to COVID
  - o Virtual Training Program has been developed, plan for implementation when next round of funds is released
  - o Working develop media to share success stories of program and trainings
  - Question to EMS Office: Initial legislation requires PSAP to have training/program in place by June 2021 but unlikely given pandemic
- HERC Update
  - o Patient Tracking Workgroup continues to refine EMTrack and implementation plans
    - EMTrack to WARDS bridge will NOT be pursued at this time due to the minority of EMS runs entered into WARDS directly statewide
  - o State/Regional Burn and Pediatric Surge plans are in-process
  - o Ongoing discussions about EMS and COVID vaccination
  - o Concerns raised about availability of EMS for inter-facility transports given the increase number and distance of transports
